## Conservation's Future

Each year around this time I watch with some interest the decisions that are made in Des Moines that may have an effect on issues related to conservation and recreation in our state. Often those decisions are minor and do not seriously affect the day to day activities as they relate to our recreation and choices.

However, this year there is a bill currently being debated in the House and Senate that has the potential to assure the sustainability of conservation and recreation programming long into the future of our state. In 2010, after the Legislature had previously approved the measure to create a constitutionally protected fund for conservation, the public voted with a 63 percent margin to permanently establish that fund. The purpose of the fund called the Natural Resource and Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund at the time of passage is to provide a permanent source of funds to insure the health of Iowa's waterways land and provide for a legacy of conservation and recreation opportunities for future generations.

To accomplish the various tasks addressed by the constitutional amendment calls for a 3/8 cent increase of the state sales tax. At the time of this writing that 3/8 cent increase is being debated in both the House and Senate. If the 3/8 cents tax should pass out of both Houses and receive the Governor's signature the Trust Fund would generate approximately \$150 million annually to be spent on seven designated areas. According to the Natural Resources Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund Report these areas include Soil Conservation and Water Protection, Watershed Protection, Natural Resources, Local Conservation Partnerships, Resource Enhancement and Protection, Trails and Lake Restoration.

What the passage of this bill could mean locally would be an increase of funding to the Conservation Board through the annual REAP allotment, the opportunity for additional grant funds for projects that are highly competitive, the opportunity for funding to create local trails and the opportunity for new funds to help reduce soil erosion and improve water quality in our area lakes and streams.

We encourage everyone to watch the progress of this bill as it is discussed in the State House. Passage of the 3/8 of a cent will provide not only the needed funding to help assure recreational and conservation for future generations but it will provide a Natural Resource Legacy that can be the pride of every Iowan.



# Geocaching: A Technological Treasure Hunt

All over the world there is a hunt going on. It is a high tech hunt. It is not a hunt for an animal, a fish, a person, or even an object. Families are getting involved and finding themselves in remote areas searching high and searching low.

Geocaching is a treasure hunt using today's technology of GPS navigation. Participants navigate to hidden caches by using a Global Positioning System (GPS) or smartphone, once in the area it is up to the hunter to find the cache. Currently there are over 1.9 million Geocaches throughout the world and over 5 million active Geocachers. Geocaching is a great activity for families, friends, or individuals to enjoy outside together.

There is no need to purchase fancy equipment or spend a lot of money on Geocaching. Anyone who has a smartphone or already has a GPS device can begin searching for caches today! To begin a participant must visit the website [www.geocaching.com](http://www.geocaching.com). By becoming a member to this website you will have access to all the geocache locations throughout the world. A basic membership is free and enables you to download the coordinates of sights directly to your GPS. After signing up participants will be able to search for geocaches in their area by focusing the map to a specific zip code.

Geocaches are all over the world, but here in Lee County we have several fun and exciting caches to search for. Most of the areas that the Lee County Conservation Board manages contain Geocaches. Currently there are twelve sights at Wilson Lake Park alone, many of the caches are located on trails, while some are located in more remote areas of the park and require more effort.

The reasons for getting involved in geocaching are endless. Some of the best reasons that people have given for getting involved in geocaching is to spend time with family or friends or to spend time outdoors. There are many clubs that have been formed to help geocachers meet each other and even have weekends and day trips to locations to help find new caches. Whatever your reason for geocaching may be, it will prove to be a worthwhile activity that you can enjoy year round no matter where you are at in the world.



**Earth Day Walk & Smores April 22, 2013**



**Objective** – These camps allow the participants to experience many hunting, conservation, and recreational opportunities that are available in the great outdoors of Iowa and become aware of the state’s great diversity. Activities are led by experts in their field, which allows participants to leave with a new found confidence in new and old activities.

**Participants** – Camps are for young adults ages 12 to 15 who enjoy the outdoors and would like to learn more and improve their skills.

**Location – Camp Lookout, Montrose, Iowa** Camp Lookout is located on the bluff of the Mississippi River above Montrose which offers a breath taking view. The diverse habitats of the area are ideal for this purpose. We will also use the Heron Bend Wildlife Area.

Lodging will be in bunk house style cabins with 12 young adults and 2 adults per cabin. You will need to bring your own linens (pillow, blanket, sheets, towels, sleeping bag, etc). Shower facilities are at the site. All buildings are smoke free. The food is included and will be prepared on site by our concessionaire. You will not be hungry!

**Chaperones** - Chaperones get a 3 day free vacation while enjoying the great outdoors with young adults. Chaperones truly make the camp flow smoothly and make a difference on what the young adults learn from this camp. The camp would not be a success without the help and support of chaperones. As a chaperone your responsibility is being a part of a group during the day and making sure the group gets to each activity. At night you are responsible for 12 young adults. But the most important responsibility is to make sure everyone is having fun, including yourself! We ask that chaperones be at least 16 years old and a background check is required prior to camp for all chaperones.
