Just completed 2nd-3rd grades AND just completed 4th-5th grades

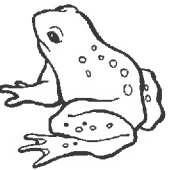
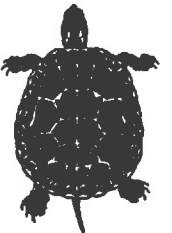
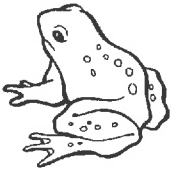
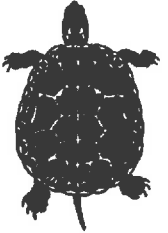

Camp will be for two consecutive days, starting 9a the first day and lasting until 4p the second day (meals and tents are provided—all they need is a sleeping bag). Camp will start and end at the Wilson Lake cabins. Space is limited to 10 boys and 10 girls. Parent overnight chaperones are encouraged and can participate in all activities for free. We ask that chaperones be at least 18 years old and pass a background check.
